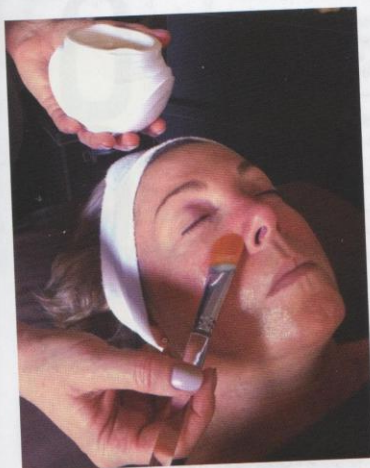


# The ORB has landed



The brain child of Jane Scrivner and Kevin McWilliams, the latest edition to the SPAPLIANCE family, the ORB, does not disappoint. *Beauty Salon News* joined Jane and her students on a SPAPLIANCE training day as they learnt how to 'ORB'.

Situated in Jane's stunning house nestled in the harmony of the Warwickshire countryside, this one day intimate course provides students with an insight into how to make the most of the ORB's array of benefits from the creator, Jane Scrivner, herself.

The day began with a warm welcome from Jane who talked us through the thought processes behind the ORB's creation. A beautifully designed, portable friend, the ORB is a continuous heat chamber for warming skincare products. By warming skincare products accurately and safely to a temperature which can be maintained for up to an hour, even with its lid off, the ORB ensures that every brush full of product is perfect every time, at every stage of the treatment.

The first half of our day was spent putting the ORB into action across a varied treatment menu. Via demonstrations and hands-on practice, we carried out facials using a variety of products from facial balms, facial oils and oil based serums, to muds, clays and paraffin wax masques. We poured the product into the designed cup, clicked it into the ORB, replaced the lid and waited a few minutes for the product to reach the perfect temperature. You can hold the ORB close to the point of application so no cooling occurs and brush full after brush full is relaxing.

Jane taught us how to apply the treatments as luxuriously as possible by dipping the brush into the product and applying with

slow 'full' strokes, melting the product into the skin. Painting facial oils from the centre of the forehead out and down to temples, for instance, creates a relaxing facial massage.

Massages were next on our menu. Oils were added to our ORBs and once heated, brushed across each section of the body slowly allowing the oils to sink into the skin whilst warming the muscles, before we continued the massage as normal. We learnt how, for clients that request a head and scalp massage, the ORB is extremely useful, allowing therapists to paint warm ORB oil slowly into the roots and scalp working section by section to ensure a deeply relaxing treatment.

After lunch, local nail expert Sarah Dane, owner of The Nail Company, Stratford-On-Avon, was on hand to demonstrate the ORB's ability to provide an extra service: paraffin wax manicures and pedicures. Adding paraffin wax pellets to the ORB and allowing to melt, Sarah painted layer after layer onto hands

before leaving to warm and then peeling away professionally. Using the ORB for treatment waxing uses less wax and painting the wax in front of clients looks professional, creating a more indulgent and bespoke service.

The beauty of the ORB is beyond physical attraction. Taking the time out to experiment and learn from Jane really allows therapists to make the most of this revolutionary machine, making their lives easier and their clients feeling extra special.
